What was your reaction when you learnt the news?


I was devastated and on the next day I didn't go to school.

What was your reaction when Marechal Petain signed the armistice?

Pétain was my idol because he had saved France but today I know that he gave up France to the Nazis and he collaborated.

Marechal Pétain was a military who won the Verdun battle (1916). He was the savior of French people so he was called for help.

I sent to Marechal Petain a letter where I talked about my admiration for him. It was like a relationship with him.

Did you resist?

No, I didn't because I was too young and I wasn't brave enough to oppose the Nazis. My brother got into the resistance but he was arrested by a militia.


What was his act of resistance?

He burnt a Nazi flag and he drew a "V" for Victory and the "Croix de Lorraine". This was a sign for resistance on a wall of the Nazi Buildings.

Was one of your close friends deported?

Yes,my best friend wore a yellow star because he was a Jew and Hitler was anti-Semitic. At first I didn't understand why he wore that star and my parents didn't want to explain me. One day my friend disappeared but I didn't know why.

Later I understood that my friend had been deported and he died on a concentration camp.
