I was a soldier of the third wave. I had to cross Omaha beach to fight the German soldiers.

What was your feeling when the ships were ashored?

The beach was covered with « asparagus » to help the ship to land on the beach. When the doors opened, I was scared and anxious. The noise was just unreal. There was a lot of shellfire, the Germans shot us with machine-guns. They were protected by the Atlantic wall. It was just terrible and frightening. We had to cross the beach, I saw a lot of my regimental comrades fall. The casualties and the dead people covered the beach. With my heavy equipement the crossing of beach was rude.
